Taking Care Of Our Older Horses

Make sure your saddle fits properly as your senior horse's topline changes. Feed your horse a high quality diet that meets all their nutrient needs. Watch for early signs of cancer or Cushing's syndrome for best treatment outcomes. Keep senior horses up-to-date on vaccines and deworming to prevent infection.

- Schedule routine dental and physical exams with your veterinarian to detect problems early.
- Make sure your saddle fits properly as your senior horse’s topline changes.
- Feed your horse a high quality diet that meets all their nutrient needs.
- Watch for early signs of cancer or Cushing’s syndrome for best treatment outcomes.
- Keep senior horses up-to-date on vaccines and deworming to prevent infection.
- Managing weight, keeping horses in light work, and stretching are all good ways to help manage arthritis.
- Horses with very poor teeth are sometimes unable to properly digest the fiber contained in hay cubes or chopped hay, simply because they cannot adequately chew the ingested material. Mushy feeds such as soaked hay pellets or beet pulp can be used in these situations



Maintaining your Horse Trailer

Trailering safely does not end when you purchase your horse trailer and learn how to drive with it. Just like anything, maintenance is important...you are hauling a member of your family in there and that's precious cargo! Here at Paul Congelosi Trailer Sales, we have a "normal service" that we recommend our customers make use of once a year.

The normal service starts with checking the wheels of the trailer. The wheels are pulled so that the bearings can be re-packed with grease. If left alone, the grease will begin to break down and will not provide proper lubrication for the bearings. The brakes must also be lubricated, so that the mechanisms in the electric brake will work properly and provide adequate stopping power. Tire tread wear and air pressure are essential to proper tracking. Worn out tires should be replaced, and pressure should always be slightly below the maximum pressure listed on the tire.

Next, we check door locks and door hinges to make sure that the hinges aren't seized and the locks are functional, and then lubricate both areas. If the horse trailer has a ramp, the hinges and springs must be checked as well. As for the electrical system of the trailer, all the lights and light plug are gone over. If the light plug is showing any signs of wear or corrosion, then it is replaced. In most cases, it is easier to replace the light plug once a year then to have to constantly check the terminals for corrosion.

After these things are taken care of, there are three structural areas of the trailer that must be gone over very carefully. The coupler is checked to make sure the locking mechanism is working, and the inside of the coupler is checked for cracks. The floor of the trailer, whether it is wood or aluminum, is examined to make sure that the integrity is maintained. Either of these materials requires maintenance, meaning that the mats must be pulled out of the trailer and the floor cleaned on a regular basis. Finally, aluminum and steel frame trailers must be checked for wear and tear. Aluminum should be checked for cracks, and steel frames, especially here in the northeast, must be checked regularly to make sure that rust is not becoming a major issue. Regular maintenance, such as reapplying undercoating, will keep rust from being an issue.

- Sunday will end with a judged class.


